1086. Laity. The lay members of the district conference with voting rights are those elected as delegates by the churches and the lay members of the district board of administration (317).

- I. General and Educational United Stewardship Fund see Church Assessments for estimated income. The actual income and expense for 2022-2023 for the Pacific Southwest District was \$945,152.78
- II. District Assessment Operating Budget see Church Assessments for estimated income and the following for estimated expense. The 2022-2023 annual income for Pacific Southwest District was \$469,909.13 from Church Assessments and \$62,734.56 miscellaneous income. Total District Operating Income was \$532,643.69 The expenses for the district were \$521,862.00
- III. District Church Extension budget for 2023-2024 is projected at \$112,221.00 The income for 2022-2023 was \$92,226,77 with expenses of \$90,000,00
- IV. Property Fund This is developed during the year by the District Board of Administration and is reported in detail in the Treasurer's Report.
- V. Agency Transfer Funds are handled and channeled as directed. See the Treasurer's Report for details of last year.
- VI. District Operating Budget This category handles the basic income and expense for the operation of the district. Net income is expected to be \$549,372.00. The income for the district operating budget comes from: local church assessments; prior year local church assessments various fees, registration fees, and reimbursements.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT State of the PSW Movement Update June 1, 2022-May 31, 2023

It is the mission of the PSW Movement to create a culture where leaders and local churches can fulfill the Great Commission in the spirit of the Great Commandment

VISION 2025

- 100 New Faith Communities
- 120 New Missional Leaders
- Every church has an intentional and measurable disciple-making process
- Every church reports salvations and baptisms every year

Elements of a Movement

- Movements by definition are uncontrollable, but they can be guidd
- Movements must be driven by the local faith communities
- Movements must have agreed upon mission (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Movements are strategy-driven, but spirit-directed (Acts 16:6-10)
- Movements morph
- Movements need spirit-empowered leaders (both clergy and lay)

To the pastors, and faithful participants in the PSW Movement. It is fantastic to be gathering together again. The power of like-minded people coming together to celebrate what God has been doing in our midst is necessary for encouragement, empowerment, and engagement.

At last year's Conference I announced my retirement to take affect at the conclusion of this year's District Conference (2023). This has made the past year a time of transition for me, the DBA and the PSW Movement.

I have been investing much of my time preparing the PSW for new leadership in the District Superintendent role. A primary purpose for announcing my retirement a year out was to give the district leadership time.

The DBA did an extensive search for the next District Superintendent. They prayed much. Searched widely. They vetted well. They will be recommending to the conference Rev. Mike Skor as the next District Superintendent. I am very proud of the DBA and the work they have done.

DISTRICT TEAM

Barbara Anderson (Executive Assistant): During COVID we made the decision to no longer have a physical office. Barbara and I have been working remotely. This change has allowed for much more flexibility for each of us. This past year Barbara and Craig relocated to the state of Florida. This has allowed them to be close to grandkids. They have continued to serve the district well. In our new age of communication, she has been able to carry out her role very well. And, if you have not yet heard: SHE WILL CONTINUE IN HER ROLE AS EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT.

We also have digitized all the district files. We have all necessary records housed in the cloud. This has made access to pertinent material much easier.

Barbara enjoys working with our pastors. She provides our pastors with what is needed, when it is needed. She is the conduit between the district office and local church leaders. She is the glue that sustains our movement initiatives.

Pastor Steve Babby (District Administrator): Pastor Steve has continued to be available with both advice and encouragement. His opinion is always honest and very helpful in navigating so many facets of the movement ministry.

He has played a major role in bringing in eight new Hispanic Churches. His tireless work with all the details surrounding the absorption of these churches has been incredible.

Dave Johnson (Assistant District Superintendent): He has been a great support to me, personally, and the district, generally. He oversees the District Board of Administration process with great insight and discernment.

He was the point man for the District Superintendent search. He coordinated the entire process. He worked alongside General Superintendent Wayne Schmidt in the search process. He did this while continuing to lead the DBMD Team and pastor his church (The River's Edge, Sacramento).

Dave, and his DBMD area leaders (Tim Kirkes, Central, CA; Chris Hughes, So Cal; Erica Farmer, AZ, and Chelsea Burke, Nor Cal), have done an outstanding job of encouraging those in the DBMD process. They have set a wonderful standard of accountability for each student.

Dave has also helped with property issues, training of leaders, working with Local Boards, and representing the district in a variety of outside connections.

Dave is genuinely a key partner in all we do to run after mission fulfillment. His theological and doctrinal expertise has been an incredible help in navigating key issues.

Brian Wilbur (Treasurer): He has done an outstanding job in updating our financial reporting and accounting systems. He does so much behind the scenes to keep the movement financially accountable.

He, along with Dave, did a great deal of footwork on the DS transition. He has been a tremendous friend and ministry colleague.

Brian not only serves the district well, but he is actively engaged in ministry at Village Church, SD.

Tim Kirkes (District secretary): He understands the importance of record keeping. He knows the organizational details we must adhere to. The DBA lay members-at-large: Connie Rollins, In Kim, Ken Brown, Joyce Howell, Heather Rosson, and Elizabeth Holmes; Ministerial members-at-large: Chris Hughes, Chris Snider, Kevin Pagano, Scott Stevenson, and Able Ledezma

This team did a stellar job of casting a wide net to find the next leader for the PSW Movement. Through prayer, interviewing, following up on references they came to an unanimous agreement on who to recommend to the Conference.

This year the following will complete their three-year tenure and will transition off: Connie Rollins, In Kim, Chris Hughes, and Chris Snider.

PASTORAL TRANSITIONS

Mark Parsons will be retiring at the end of June 2023. Mark and his wife Karen have led New Life, Tucson for many years.

CHURCHES

All churches have lifecycles, and, unfortunately, one of our faith communities came to the completion of theirs: Chester Wesleyan Church

Antioch Wesleyan Church called Ian Ahlstrom to lead them in their next season of growth and Great Commission effectiveness. It is wonderful having Ian & Megan as part of the PSW Movement Team

Christian Faith Fellowship, Tucson has begun a video venue in Sedona, AZ.

New Life, Tucson has called Kyle Barber to lead them. Kyle is a graduate of our Emerging Leader Network. He and his wife, Malinda, along with their new son, Levi, will begin July 1.

Skyline Church opened their Tempe, AZ campus. Tevin Lucas is the Campus Pastor. He is doing an outstanding job of making inroads onto the Arizona State University Campus.

Chester, New Hope CC: In death often comes life. We closed Chester Wesleyan in October of 2022. Then God raised up Doug and Bonnie Brower to relocate to Chester and launch a new faith community, New Hope CC. They are using the former Chester Wesleyan building. This new work launched on Easter Sunday 2023.

Norwalk Christian Fellowship, under the leadership of Jofre Lumahan, started two new churches this year. They are sponsoring New Beginnings, in the Los Angeles area and beginning a brand new work in Las Vegas.

MULTIPLYING DISCIPLES

The PSW is a movement grounded in multiplication. It begins with the multiplication of disciples. The C.O.R.E. of disciple-making is to develop a process for helping Christ-followers

Consistently connect with God; Obedience to the Spirit; Reflect Biblical values in our lifestyles; Engage in the mission of Jesus. This CORE will help us develop life-long followers of Jesus.

Each of our churches must continue to ask: What is a disciple? What are we doing to build a disciple-making culture in our church? How effective is our process for making disciples?

The multiplication of leaders is achieved through a variety of delivery systems. I have continued to invest time in our Lead Pastors through **Leadership Connection.**

- Increased ministry effectiveness
- Sharing resources
- Life-transformation

MULTIPLYING CHURCHES: 100 by 2025

Cody Bren has been leading our church multiplication emphasis for the past several years. He helps recruit and vet church planters. He exposes the PSW Leaders to multiplication through Exponential each year. He coaches churches in the strategies and processes to plant churches.

Ultimately, however, it is about local churches planting churches. It is never about the size of the church, but the size of the church's heart for mission.

I mentioned Norwalk Christian Fellowship earlier in my report. This is not a numerically large congregation. What they are is a congregation that has a large heart for Kingdom expansion. In addition to the two churches they are starting this year, over the years they have planted a church in Northern California, and seven churches in the Philippines.

What might you do to help start a new faith community?

I am grateful for the PSW Movement local leaders who continue to grasp and pursue the fulfillment of the **Great Commission in the spirit of the Great Commandment.** It is a joy to see how spirit led leaders use all kinds of methods to multiply DISCIPLES, LEADERS, and CHURCHES.

CONCLUSION

Joni and I would like to thank you all for allowing us to serve you as DS these past 8 years. It has been a time of challenges, accomplishments, unexpected turns, and great celebrations. We have had a front row seat to God's work in our movement. People coming to Christ. People being baptized. Churches being planted. Leaders being developed.

Looking back we see the faithfulness of God. He has blessed us beyond measure. The experiences we have had were incredible. We were privileged to build off the solid foundation laid by Pastor Steve Babby.

We are thrilled to hand the baton off to Mike & Kiley Skor. They will lead you into greater effectiveness. I parrot what the late Ira Shanonfelt always said to me when I was a young leader, "The best is yet to come!" And I believe that for the PSW Movement.

People have asked, as they do anyone who is leaving a role, what will you miss? The main thing is the leaders of the PSW Movement. You have poured into us. Allowed us to grow along with you. You have believed in the mission to multiply DISCIPLES, LEADERS, and CHURCHES. Thank you!

I am excited for the future of the PSW Movement. You will be calling a leader in Mike Skor who understands church growth and church multiplication. He has a heart for both and models them.

Most importantly his heart breaks for lost people. He is driven by the passion to see more and more people come into the Kingdom. He wants to see all kinds of methods used to reach all kinds of people in all kinds of places to glorify God.

This is the business we are in. This is the clarion call of God's word. This is why Jesus came. We are to run with reckless abandon after Great Commission initiatives. Mike will lead you well in this pursuit!

CHURCHES

ANTIOCH, ANTIOCH CHURCH FAMILY: Phil requested and received permission from WIF to move them to interest only payments Aug-Dec 2022 (8/19). The Howell Repayment Proposal

was approved. The church was made a developing church (8/19). Approved the sale of their property (3/31*). The property was listed on April 21 for \$2.8M (5/4*).

ANTIOCH, ANTIOCH WESLEYAN CHURCH: Approved Ian Ahlstrom as pastor. He comes in as a Supply-Pastor in Process of denominational transfer. His first Sunday was April 16 (3/28*). He was installed on April 30 (5/4).

BONITA, SWEETWATER COMMUNITY CHURCH: The board approved their request to obtain a \$100,000.00 WIF loan to install solar panels (10/13).

BUENA PARK, GOD'S FAMILY CHURCH: Tim Yu was approved as a ministerial student (9/15).

Tim Yu was approved as an assistant pastor (3/31*).

BUENA PARK, RIVER OF HOLY SPIRIT: They were changed to Mission Church status (10/13).

CARSON CITY, HOPE CROSSING COMMUNITY CHURCH: Nick Emery's extended call vote was 5-28-23 (5/4).

CHESTER, CHESTER WESLEYAN CHURCH: The DBA voted to close the church effective October 24, 2022 (10/19*). The board voted to Allow Cary Sanders and his family to stay at the parsonage past March 31 and to vacate the premises no later than Monday, April 17 (2/16).

CHESTER, NEW HOPE COMMUNITY CHURCH: Appointed Doug Brower as Pastor of New Hope Community Church. They are using the former Chester Wesleyan building (11/10). They had a soft opening on Sunday, March 26 with 18 in attendance and had 28 at their Easter service. The Brewers have moved into the parsonage. Phil and Joni visited the church and evaluated the poor condition of the parsonage. The DBA approved a grant of up to \$20,000.00 (from WIF Building Funds) for parsonage renovation (5/4).

CYPRESS, NEW LAND CHURCH: Changed to Mission Church status (10/13).

EL CAJON, EL CAJON WESLEYAN CHURCH: The DBA approved the merger of El Cajon Wesleyan and One Church contingent on the approval of the EWC Membership. They are currently both meeting on ECW's campus. The congregations will meet to vote on this on June 11. One Church will merge into ECW. They are currently using the name ONE ECW (5/4).

EL MONTE, PRINCIPE DE PAZ: The DBA gave them a \$35,000 grant for the renovation of the former Distrito Hispano Parsonage and District office. They were also approved to seek a WIF loan of up to \$80,000 (10/13).

ENCINITAS, BEACH CHAPEL: Their current outstanding Loan is \$13,458. The district has offered that if they pay \$5000 toward the loan by Dec 31, 2022 the remainder of the loan will be forgiven. The monthly payment of this loan (\$500/mo) will then be applied to their USF Investment (9/15*).

FAIRFIELD, EDGE COMMUNITY CHURCH: The Executive DBA approved them to make an offer on a property in Fairfield (7/28*).

GRANITE BAY, EAST PARKWAY CHURCH: The board agreed to sell the property for 2.5M (7/12). Escrow closed on August 17 and the building was sold (8/19).

LA HABRA HEIGHTS, NA SUNG WESLEYAN: James Shin's credentials have been revoked for conduct unbecoming a minister (10/11). The lawsuit brought against the church has been dismissed (2/16).

LA MESA, SKYLINE CHURCH: The Executive DBA approved them to seek up to \$250,000 for a first mortgage Loan to finance improvements at the Hardy Drive, Tempe, AZ property (10/5*). The district provided them a \$3000 grant to be used toward their intern program (5/4).

LA PUENTA, HOPE CHRISTIAN CHURCH: They began their pastoral search process in January 2023 (7/12). We paid their principle and interest WIF payment Oct-Dec 2022 (10/13).

LAWNDALE, LAWNDALE WESLEYAN CHURCH: Matthew Harbison received a two year call. The vote was May 22, 2022. He received a 100% vote (44-0). He was approved by the ExDBA (5/31/22*). Mathew was installed on June 19, 2022 (7/12). Erica Harbison and Lexi Tucker were approved as ministerial students (9/15).

MISSION VIEJO, MISSION VIEJO JAPANESE CHURCH: They were moved to mission church status (5/4).

DISTRICT CONFERENCE 2022 MINUTES

Conference of The Pacific Southwest District of The Wesleyan Church Daily Proceedings, July 12-13, 2022

ORDINATION SERVICE: Tuesday, July 12 at 6:30pm

The Pacific Southwest District of the Wesleyan Church met for its thirty-second annual conference at Skyline Wesleyan Church in La Mesa, California on July 12-13, 2022. The conference began with an ordination service on Tuesday evening. Rev. Johanna Chacon Rugh, Director of Education & Clergy Development for the Wesleyan Church, preached from Psalm 121. She challenged the ordinands to remember that ministry is not a job, it is a calling and therefore we need to be dependent on God.

Three people were ordained: Becky Dolan, Frank Worley, and Brian Whalen. Timothy Smith, officially transferred in as an ordained minister from another denomination. A reception for friends and family followed the service.

BUSINESS SESSIONS: Wednesday, July 13 at 9:00am

BUSINESS SESSION ONE: 9:00am-10:30am

Conference Organization: Phil Stevenson chaired the conference and Johana Chacon Rugh, Director of Education & Clergy Development, was our guest from headquarters.

OPENING: Jeremy McGarity, pastor of Skyline Church, welcomed everyone and opened the conference in prayer. After an OKWU video, Jim Dunn shared a devotion from 2 Timothy 3 where he reminded us of our call to soul winning. He challenged us to stop talking about the world and start talking to it because Jesus has the power to save and to deliver.

Call to Order & Roll Call: Phil Stevenson called the session to order and Tim Kirkes and Chris Snider gave instructions for the roll call. Both roll call and voting was done electronically. There were 162 voting delegates: 98 lay and 64 ministerial.

Greetings from the General Superintendent: The conference was shown a video greeting from Dr. Wayne Schmidt encouraging us to be a kingdom force. Johanna Chacon Rugh explained "Make the Most" prayer cards that were handed out to delegates.

Ministry Interview: Phil interviewed Jason Sneddon who will be leading Skyline's Raytown MO campus. The conference paused to pray for their launch scheduled for September 18.

Election of Lay DBA Members: Phil read the brief bios and those who were on the ballot and they came forward and were introduced to the conference. Heather Rosson and Elizabeth Holmes were elected to serve three year terms. Voting Results: 312 votes cast. 78 needed to elect. Elizabeth Holmes 113 votes, Heather Rosson 105 votes and Janet Stucke 94 votes.

Introduction of New Hispanic Leaders: The following leaders who have become a part of the PSW Movement were introduced and welcomed to the movement: Asdrubal & Maria Chacon; Alvaro & Damaris Sanchez; Juan & Elizabeth Vargas; Pedro & Francisca Orantes; and Benjamin & Heike Bocanega.

Ministry Interview: Phil interviewed Pastor Pedro Orantes of Iglesia Cristiana Templo de Poder in Los Angeles. He shared about their small groups ministry as a key to discipleship.

Election of Ministerial DBA Members: Phil read the brief bios of those who were on the ballot and those present came forward and were introduced to the conference.
